To the Principal

As you know, bus drivers have the very important responsibility of ensuring that your students are transported to and from school in a safe manner. Drivers are also required to issue directions to ensure the safety of all customers.

It has come to our attention that some students practise dangerous behaviour by walking out in front of the bus after disembarking. This does not only cause anxiety amongst our Drivers, the students are putting themselves at risk and in a worst case scenario they might lose their life should a car hit them as they walk out in front of the bus. I would therefore like to ask that you remind your students of the importance to respect and listen to their Driver, and explain the risk they put themselves in when they walk out in front of a bus. An approaching car, even in a school zone travelling at 40km/hour, can take their life.

Please remind your students of their responsibilities and advise that mutual respect between drivers and students will ensure a safe and pleasant journey for all.
